

Report to the Community 2022

Girl Scouts of Northeastern New York



Our rally cry this year was that the world needs more Girl Scouts! We know the positive impact Girl Scouts have on the world—and the impact the Girl Scout program has on our members. As we continue to recover from the impacts of the pandemic, the world can certainly use the influence of more Girl Scouts, girls who are capable of doing great things, supporting others, and living our mission to make the world a better place.

To create a world with more Girl Scouts, we spent time in 2022 developing our Strategic Plan for the next 3 years. This included conducting a Market Assessment from both member families and community members to better understand barriers to joining, relevancy of Girl Scouting from the messages they see from us, what they want to get out of their Girl Scout experience, and more. We learned that our girl members are more highly satisfied with their Girl Scout experience and more likely to stay than the national average. We also learned that 94% of caregivers of non-Girl Scouts were aware of Girl Scouting.

This was a very complex stage, resulting in more ideas than it is reasonable to undertake! We then prioritized the ideas, taking into account budget and staffing constraints as well as the projected impact on the Girl Scout experience. Our board, staff, and delegates attended a retreat at the historic Edith Macy Conference Center to further refine our strategic goals in these categories: Reach and Retain More Girls, Transform Volunteer Experience, Relevant Brand, Strengthen and Diversify Revenue, Effective Operations, and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

These strategic efforts will help us in our ultimate goal to triple our membership by 2025, to reach more girls through Girl Scouting. Why do girls need Girl Scouting? Our programs support girls during this unprecedented mental health crisis among girls, creating a safe space to be themselves with a network of caring adults and peers, and providing FUN, which is a protective factor against depression, anxiety, and more. And long-term, Girl Scout alums report more positive life outcomes than their peers: a higher sense of self, more involved in volunteer work, more likely to vote, attained more degrees, and earning a higher household income. Girl Scouts is uniquely positioned to equip all girls with the skills they need to succeed academically and lead in their own lives. We hope you will join us in the coming year, as we build girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place.

Updates from Across the Council

Girl Experience Team

Seven teams of Girl Scouts collected food for families facing food insecurity, and used the donations to build Carnival-themed structures during Girls Can Do. We were awarded second place as a Hunger Hero at the Capital Region CANstruction 11th Annual Harvest Evening Celebration for collecting 6 tons of food.



Fifteen girls and 13 adults tried a new experience: the Wolf Mountain Nature Center camping program. Girl Scouts learned how wolves communicate with their body language, scent marking, and vocalizations. They toured the facility, assisted caretakers in feeding the animals over their fences, and camped in tents at the center.

SPOTLIGHT on Summer Camp

GSNENY hosted day camps at Camp Is-Sho-Da and Lake Clear camp and resident camps at Hidden Lake Camp and Lake Clear Camp during a summer where many organizations, including other Girl Scout Councils, cancelled summer camp programs in light of the ongoing pandemic, staffing challenges, and rising transportation costs. We served a total of 901 girls through these programs and an additional 158 girls through Cookie Camp! This was a group effort supported by council staff and volunteers acting as counselors to ensure girls had a great camp experience. Donations from many individuals, the Carl E. Touhey Foundation, the Chapel Hill Foundation, Adirondack Foundation—The Cairn Fund, and the Niskayuna Community Foundation General Fund of the Community Foundation for the Greater Capital Region supported these summer camp experiences.



Volunteer Services Team

At the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner in Albany, we recognized Girl Scouts with 20 or more years of service for a combined 530 years of service!



Outdoor Education Weekend included a new Fishing 101 session, which was a big hit! Everyone caught a fish, even if it was only the gummy variety.



To best support our volunteers, we updated a lot of resources:

Orientation Guides for each camp, the Encampment Director Guide, and the Train the Trainer program.

Philanthropy Team

Ignite Her Flame raised over \$26,000 to support our camps and outdoor programs!

Women of Distinction honored 4 local women for their impact in the careers and communities. This event raised almost \$14,000 to support Girl Scouting.

Camp Affinity Groups started forming and supporting our camps! Friends of Lake Clear Camp renovated the waterfront closet with improved storage for supplies, plenty of room for damp life vests to finish drying, and gave it a seahorse-themed makeover.



Properties Team

Our small and mighty team accomplished a lot in 2022! In addition to the normal maintenance of our properties, they:

- installed a new woodstove in Wright's Cottage at Hidden Lake Camp
- improved the Troop House at Camp Woodhaven and lodges at Camp Meadowbrook with new interior paint
- started renovations at Weld House at Lake Clear Camp

They also arranged transportation for donated furniture and fixtures to improve our camps.

Updates from Across the Council

Product Program Team

More than 190 Girl Scouts participated in Project Warm Up, the Sweets & Treats service project, donating hats, scarves, and mittens to keep people warm this winter.

Gift of Caring donations allowed Girl Scouts to donate over 30,000 packages of Cookies to the Red Cross, veterans, and active military through Adopt a Soldier.



Girls "learn while they earn" during Sweets & Treats and the Cookie Program, and 173 Girl Scouts earned the opportunity to attend a special Cookie Camp program.

Membership Team

To support more new members, GSNENY piloted Starter Troops with support from GSUSA. Twelve new troops started and transitioned to volunteer leadership by the end of 4 staff-supported meetings. Troop 5522 invited sister Girl Scouts from 2 Starter Troops for a stream study day with Columbia Land Conservancy to discover what lives in local waterways.



Executive Office

The Executive Office led the charge of our strategic planning, with the theme: Tomorrow is Ours! With record engagement by members, Girl Scouts, volunteers, and community members, we charted our course for recovery with a long range property plan, membership and recruitment plan, techniques to improve the volunteer experience and all on solid financial footing.

We enhanced our Council's governance, as signified by recruiting the largest new class of members to the Board of Directors, and showing growth in the number of elected Council delegates, who represent members to the board!

We are also preparing for the 51st National Convention and facilitating the election of three girl and two adult National Delegates plus three adult alternates to represent GSNENY at the National Council Session in July 2023.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

GSNENY has made bold moves to ensure our Girl Scout Council is welcoming to all eligible members and inclusive in creating a place of belonging for our diverse communities of staff, volunteers, and Girl Scouts.

We have made a commitment to being an Anti-Racist organization, which means we actively oppose racism and work towards creating racial equity at our Council and in our communities. Tangible Development was engaged to conduct an anti-racism audit of our Council and staff, and volunteer task force members engaged in anti-racism training. Finance Specialist Lisa Shaw was selected to participate in GSUSA's Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Racial Justice Task Force at the national level.

GSNENY also clarified our summer camp policies and protocols to be clear about the inclusion of gender expansive Girl Scouts at summer camp and council-led programs, to ensure that we are providing a safe, inclusive environment for all.

Member Care Team

We updated our website to better serve our members and the wider community. We added new property rentals resources and orientations. We launched online booking forms for people interested in renting our camps. A new online registration system streamlined processes and sign-ins for members. We also added a live chat feature to our website to provide more support to member families. Outside of business hours, this feature points visitors to Frequently Asked Questions that may assist them.

GSNENY invited our members and supporters to celebrate with Norma Langevin before her retirement.

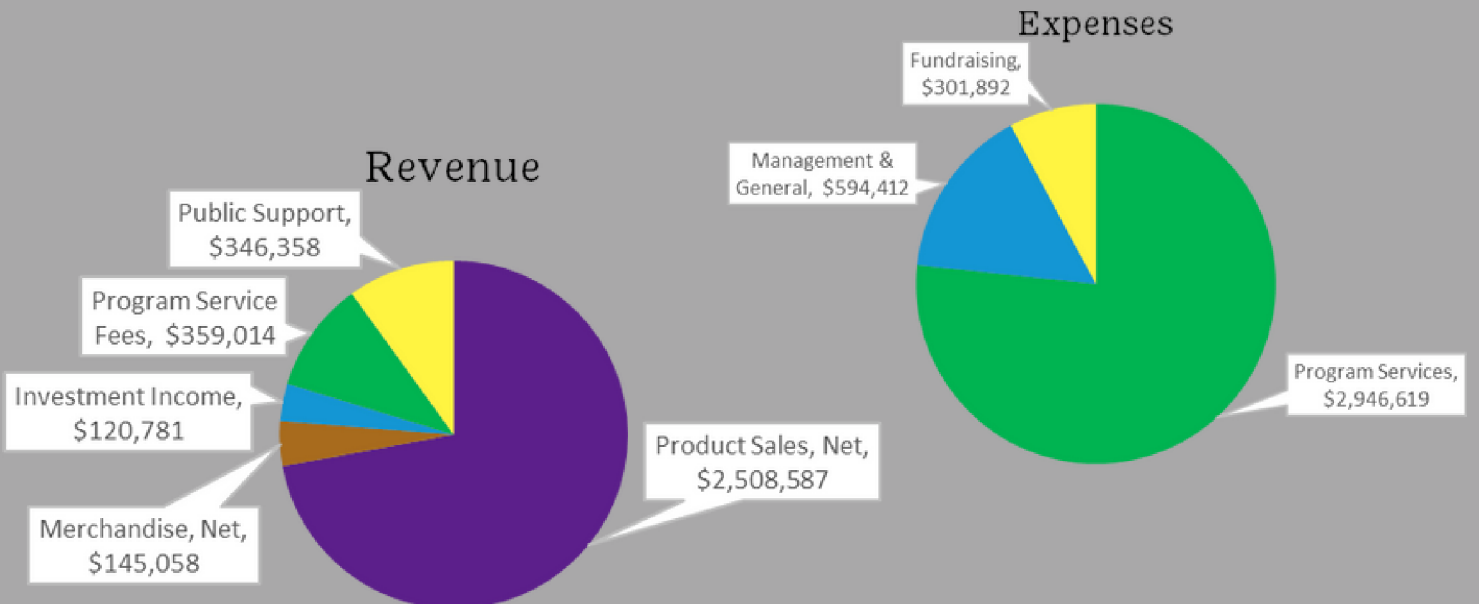
