Appropriate money-earning projects involve girls providing a service or a product they create. Some examples include:

- Washing cars
- Making and selling an item
- Preparing meals
- Putting on a dance
- Providing child care services during an event
- Providing gift-wrapping services
- Collecting items for recycling
- Yard work
- Walking pets
- Planning and running a program

Girls cannot be involved in:

- Product demonstrations
- Drawings
- Games of chance
- Direct solicitations of cash*
- Endorsement or sale of commercial products, including sales generating profits for a business or company other than Girl Scouts

- Printing a brochure for a Gold Award project
- Fabric for a community service project
